



UNB SUMMER FIELD SCHOOL IN ARCHAEOLOGY

The Department of Anthropology, University of New Brunswick, will offer an archaeological field school (9 credit hours) during the 2009 Summer Session. The field school will provide practical experience in archaeological excavation techniques, cultural resource management (CRM) archaeology, the identification of common archaeological materials and basic archaeological interpretation.

Students will participate in a CRM archaeology project at Washademoak Lake, Queens County, N.B. Students will be commute from Fredericton to the field location each day. Transportation and mid-day meals will be provided by the project.

Dates: Summer Session, July 2 to August 12, 2009

Prerequisites: 3 credit hours of second-level archaeology and permission of the instructor

Tuition fees: approximately \$1650.00; some additional fees may be applicable
